WORKSHOP: Encouraging Learning Through Writing



Over 75 participants heard Dr. David Landis speak about how to use writing to foster learning at the MA TESOL workshop on Oct. 5. Dr. Landis said that writing is a great tool to discover what we are thinking. Since writing gives us a record of our thinking, teachers should let students capture those

thoughts to review and use them in later drafts. Some exploratory techniques include dual-entry diary, writing dialogs between people with opposing views, writing a letter about what the student is thinking, and free-writing.
