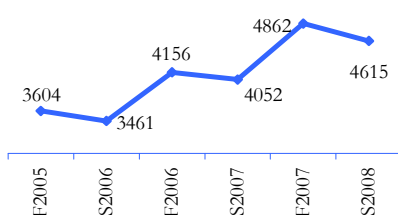

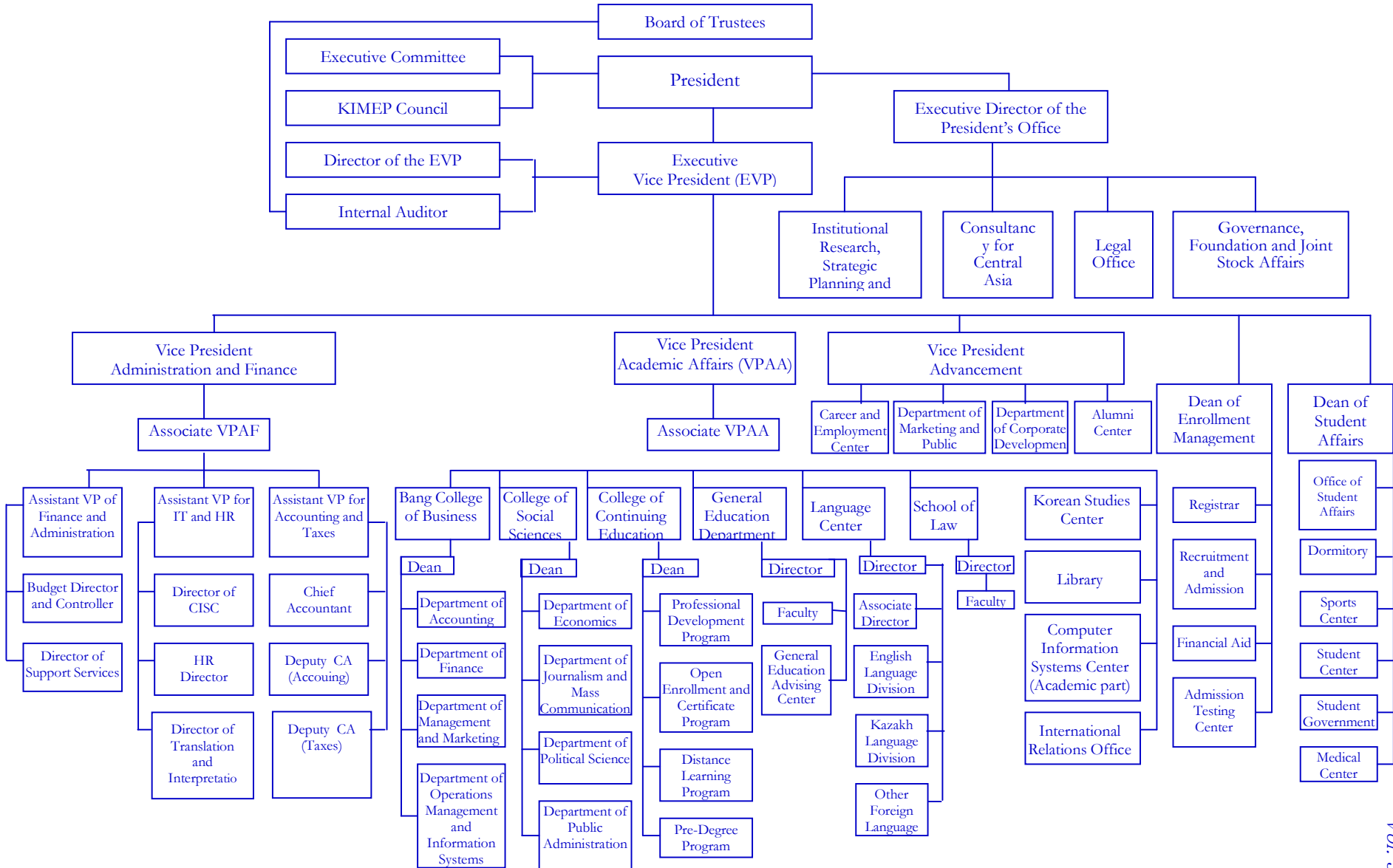

(as of June, 2008)



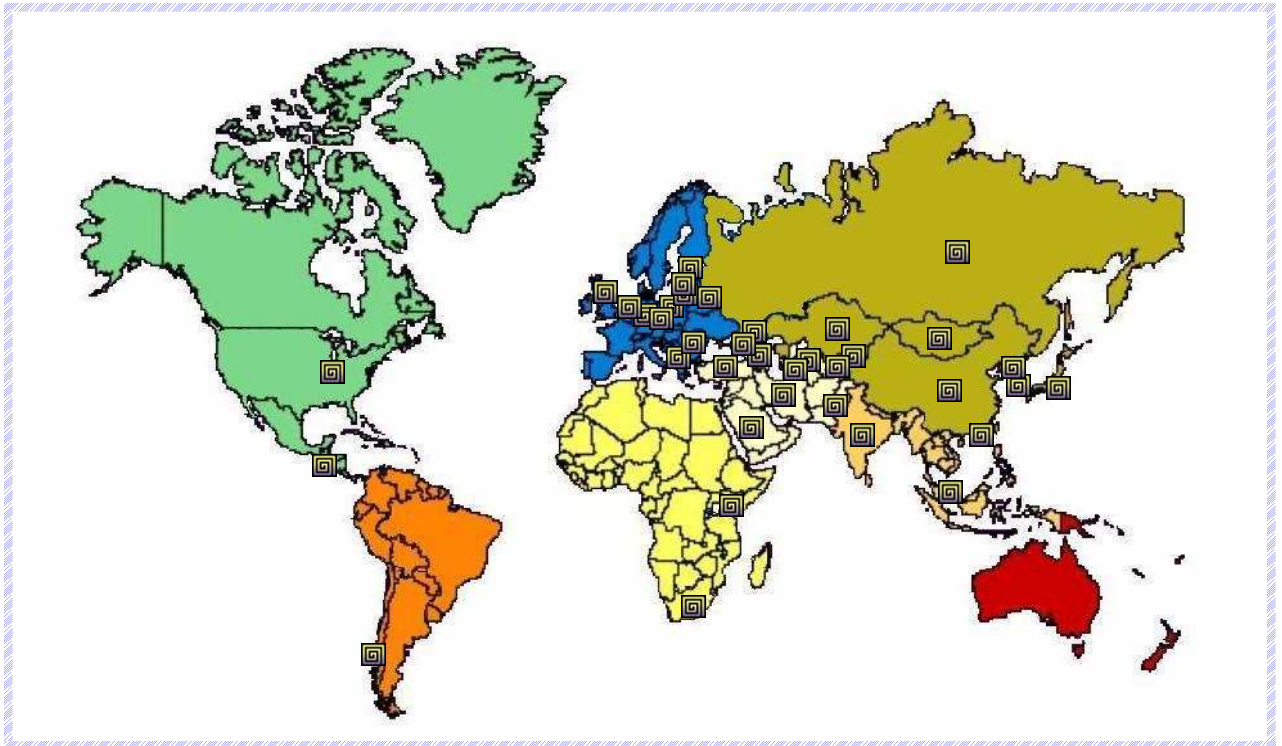

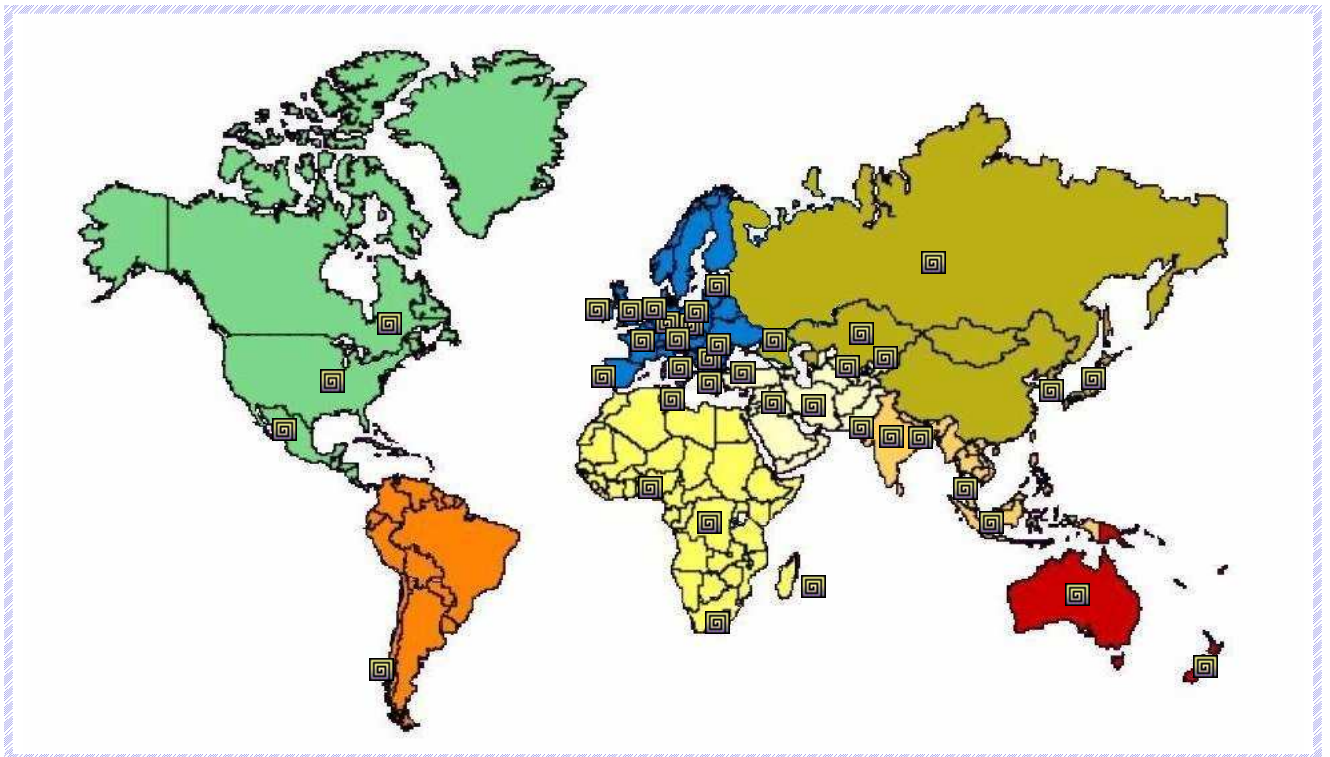

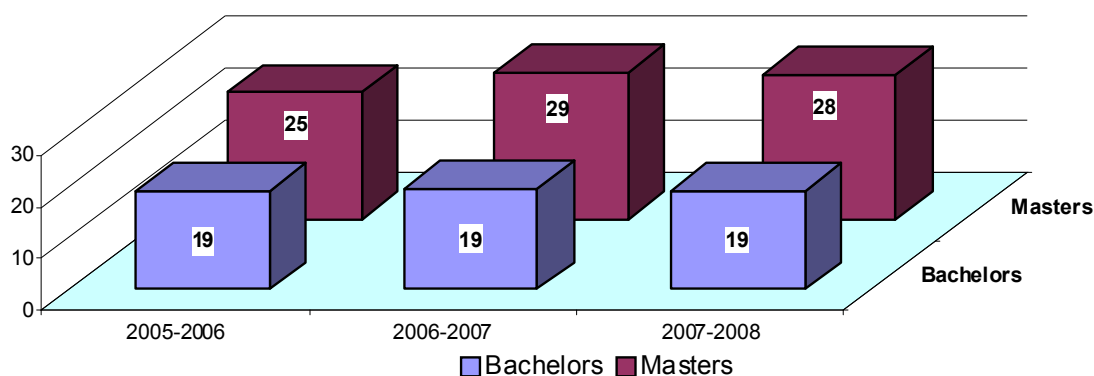

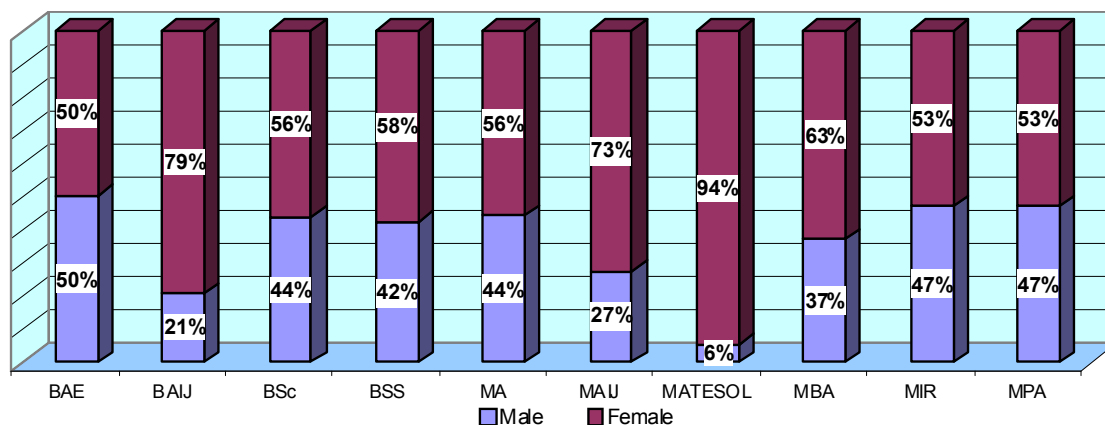

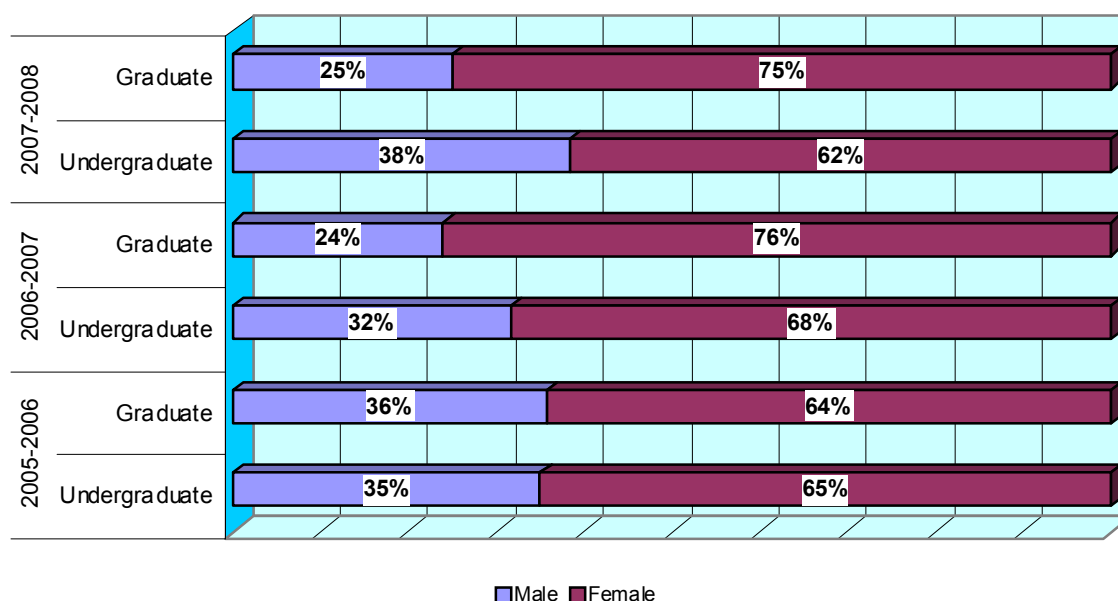

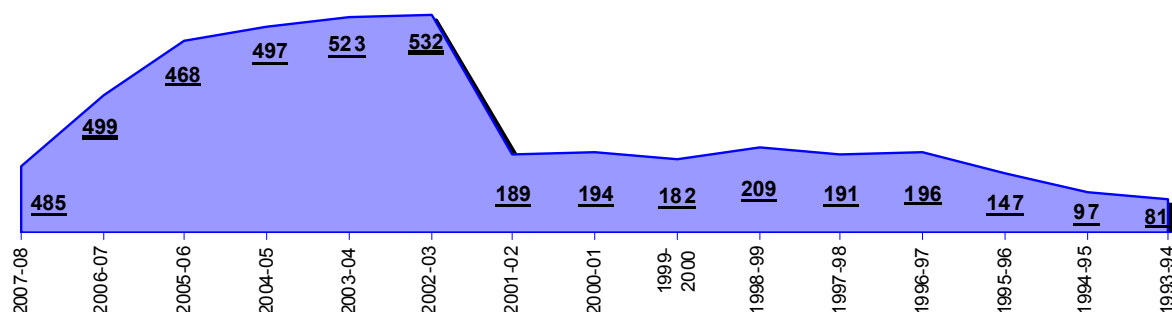

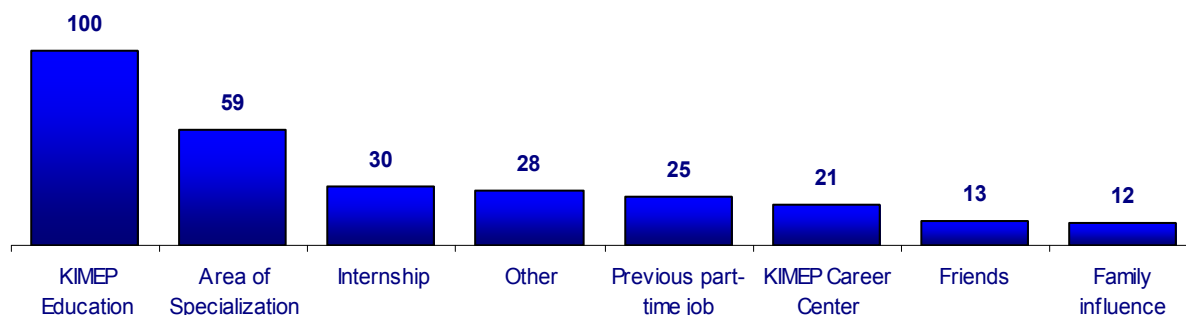

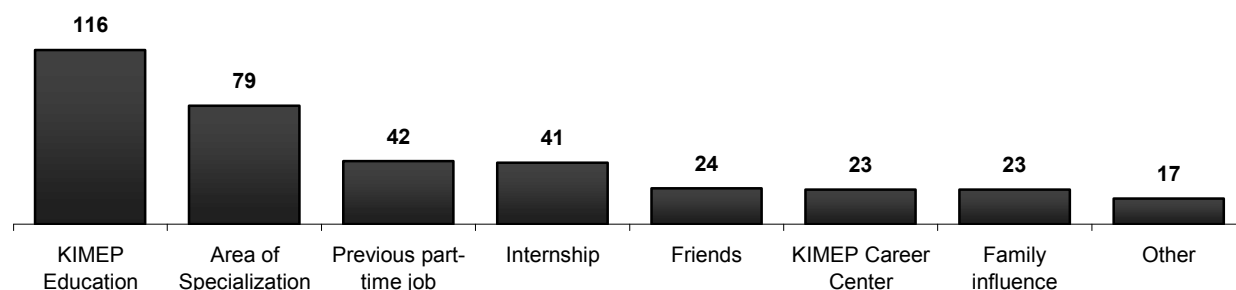


## EMPLOYMENT AND SALARY

### Factors assisting in getting first job after graduating from KIMEP, 2006<sup>♦</sup>

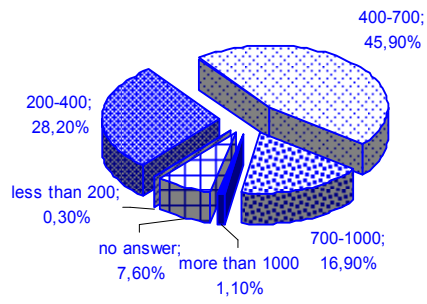

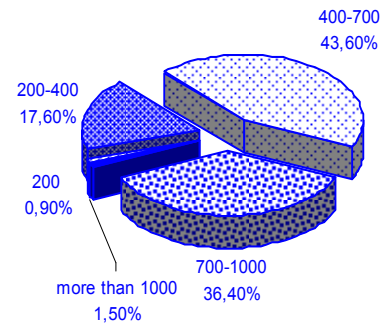

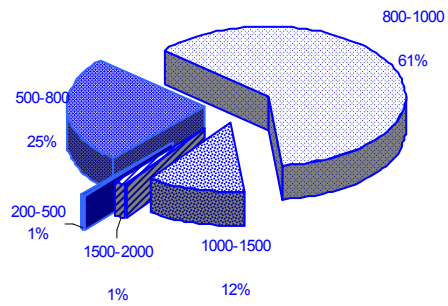
Salary Level of KIMEP Alumni 2005 (USD)

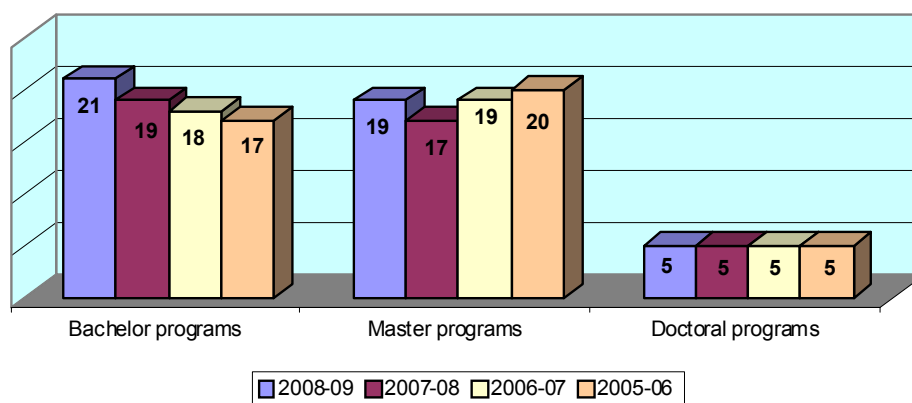

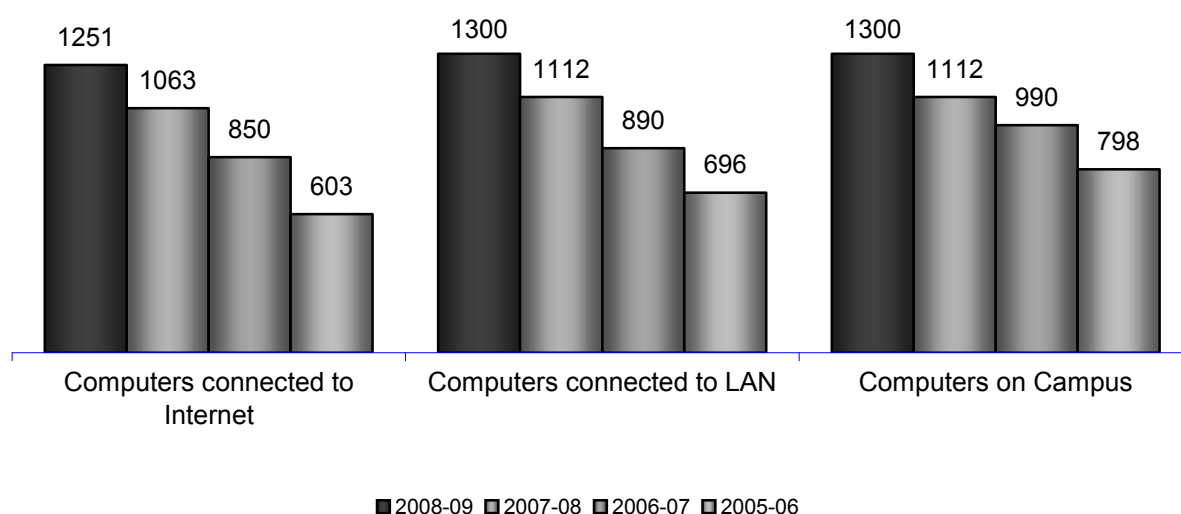

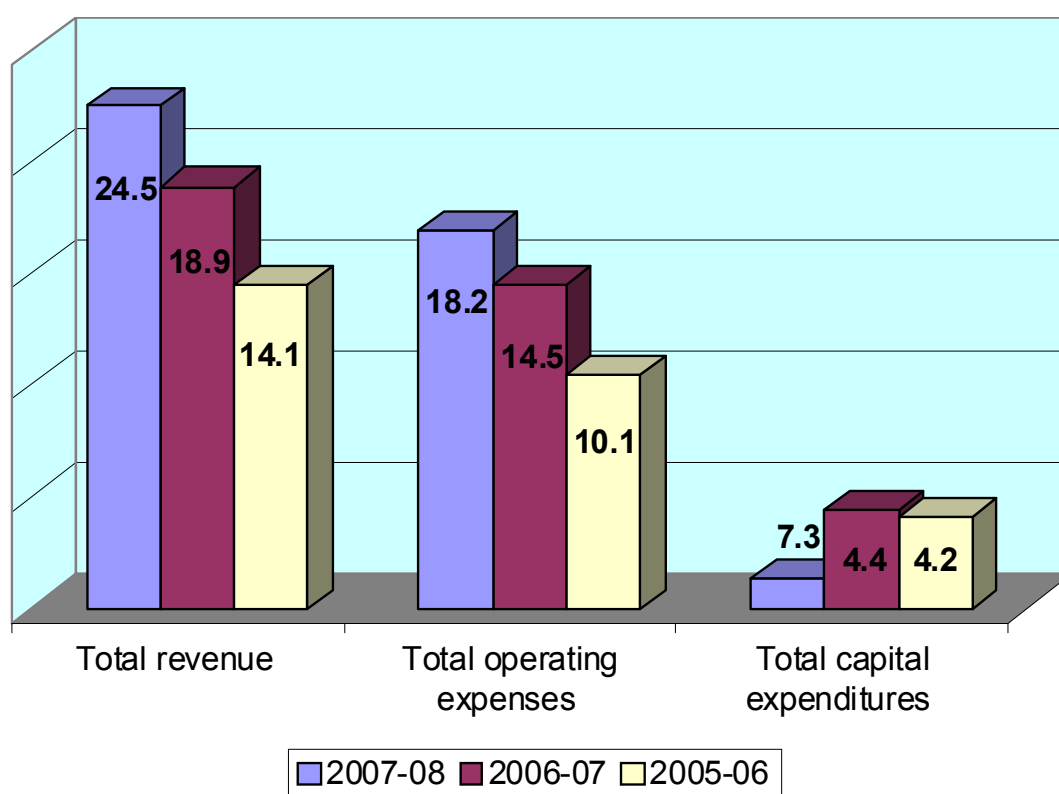
